DR. STEPHEN LEFRAK

Professor of Medicine at Washington University School of Medicine, and a nationally recognized clinician/teacher in pulmonology and critical care medicine.

For the past 17 years he has served as Assistant Dean, directing the Program on Humanities in Medicine at Washington University School of Medicine, and is a member of the executive committee for the Center for the Study of Ethics and Human Values. He was a founding member of, and served as chairman of the Barnes Jewish Hospital Ethics Committee for more than 15 years. Dr. Lefrak also serves as a Medical Ethics Consultant for the American Broadcast Company and its network affiliates.

Dr. Lefrak holds an AB with honors in philosophy from Colgate University, and is an AOA graduate of the medical school at the State University of New York, Downstate Medical Center.

Amongst his many medical accomplishments, Dr. Lefrak is also a leading authority on the history of Nazi medical research, and was instrumental in identifying Freiderich Wegener as a Nazi, and through his campaign, the disease 'Wegeners granulomatosis' was recently renamed.
